
Across West Yorkshire (WY), we will work together to establish an Online Harms programme, to support the success of our ambition for;

West Yorkshire to be a Trauma Informed and Responsive system by 2030 and develop a whole system approach to responding to multiple disadvantage

Impact

- 1. West Yorkshire will establish a sustainable WY Trauma Informed social media and online harms programme.
- West Yorkshire will have a skilled and knowledgeable workforce to support the system around ensuring social media is trauma informed and online harms are prevented.
- 3. The WY workforce are prepared and able to respond to children and young people who may have experienced or are currently experiencing adversity & trauma as a result of social media use
- 4. The WY workforce will respond early to prevent and address any potential harms and risks relating to children and young people's use of social media and exposure to online harms

Activities

- Developing provision to ensure trauma informed: e-safety, online safety, data, cybersecurity, safeguarding and media literacy from the end user to commissioners
- Developing a WY online safety bill
- Coproduce resources and tools with people with lived experience
- Developing training in partnership with the WY multi agency Training Collaborative
- Identify collaborative and match funding to support sustainability
- Supporting local initiatives and priorities through partnership working
- Intelligence and information sharing, collection, and analysis

Outputs

- Resources and tools to support providers and commissioners to ensure all social media is trauma informed and prevent online harms
- Bespoke ATR training for WY for social media and online harms
- All organisations will be aware of policy and legislation in relation to ATR, social media, and online harms
- Development of local policy and guidance to prevent harm caused online and via social media

Outcomes

- Improved awareness and reduction in cybercrime
- Reduce online harm in relation to images and videos
- Reduction of online gambling, debt and problematic issues
- Increase safe use of social media
- Ensure all providers across WY are aware and responsive to online harms and are able to prevent harm.
- Early recognition and prevention of adversity and trauma caused by social media and online
- Reduction of adversity and trauma
- TI support for Victims of online harm
- Reduction in serious violence and exploitation related to online harm and social media
- Reduction in self harm and suicide related to online harm and social media
- Reduction in psychological harm caused by social media and online content
- Reduction of online exploitation and grooming
- Reduction in targeted abuse; VAWG, cyber bullying, hate and harassment
