1.	<p>Welcome & Introductions</p> <p>EI advised the group that Carrie Rae was no longer on the programme due to organisational changes. This will mean an impact in capacity, but the VRU are offering some more capacity and a Project Manager on the Prevention Programme who will be giving a day per week to this work.</p>	
2.	<p>Any Other Business</p> <p>Knowledge & Skills Framework Workshop</p> <p>EI provided a presentation that Warren Larkin had developed for the Knowledge and Skills Framework Workshop held on Friday 2nd September.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>WY Knowledge and Skills Workshop 01.</p> <p>EI explained that the decision was made at the workshop to go with Scottish framework but bespoke it for West Yorkshire i.e. prevention/resilience/inequalities. There is a 6 month timeline to pull the framework together.</p> <p>Warren suggested that we use the Training Collaborative as a reference group although it is not an expectation that anyone from the group authors the framework unless anyone would like to volunteer. We will</p>	<p>EI/CA provide template for each section of the Framework and email to colleagues to request authors. Members of the group can share the documents with any colleagues who they feel could contribute.</p>

	<p>ask the network for volunteers to provide the first draft which will be taken to the Knowledge and Skills Framework group, the second draft will be sent to wider stakeholders and then the final draft will be launched at the Knowledge Exchange in 2023. We will provide a template for each of the areas for the authors with a realistic timeline so that colleagues know how much of their time will be required.</p> <p>EI advised that this group are developing templates/tools for the theory of change at the Trauma Informed Organisations meetings. EI added that the next meeting is on Monday 12th September and advised that if anyone was interested in joining this group to contact CA.</p> <p>This was discussed and EI agreed to ask Sandra Bloom to present at a future meeting and ask Alisha Moreland-Capua to do some specific work with us.</p> <p>Trauma Informed Training EI informed the group that the training is challenging at the moment as we only have Warren Larkin and Lisa Cherry. Kirklees have brought in their own training and if we think this meets our standards, we will add the provider to our list of accredited suppliers.</p> <p>CP commented that the feedback from staff regarding the housing training and the difference that it has made. EI suggested that we look at the feedback and look at how we roll it out wider in the housing sector.</p> <p>EI added that herself and Sarah Roxby, Service Director – Housing and Health for Wakefield District Housing were attending a global conference to present this work.</p> <p>Train the Trainer Task & Finish Group EI advised that we have set up a Train the Trainer Task and Finish Group and they are meeting on 15th September. Warren Larkin will pull together the product and we will then buy this from him. This was discussed and the group wondered whether we could attach an accreditation to Warren’s training.</p> <p>Funding Bid EI advised that a funding bid has been submitted by the VRU for trauma informed training in education.</p> <p>EI asked the group to let us know if they were applying for any funding as we can provide support with bids.</p>	<p>EI to ask Sandra Bloom to present at a future meeting and ask Alisha Moreland-Capua to do some specific work with us.</p> <p>CA to contact Housing Leads and arrange a meeting.</p>
3.	<p>Culture Competency Training Framework & Humility Training – Community Mental Health Transformation, WYH&CP – Gary Blake GB provided a presentation and explained the content. GB asked the group if they would like to be represented on the Training Steering Group and everyone agreed that this would be beneficial.</p>	<p>GB to send slides and framework to CA to share with the group.</p>
4.	<p>Theory of Change</p>	

	<p>EI advised that she will send the original theory of change document to the group and asked that people check that it still stands but if anything needs updating/changing to feedback to EI or CA. There were some suggestions made during the meeting.</p>	<p>EI will draft with comments from the meeting and send to the group for comments/feedback</p>
5.	<p>ATR Fellowship</p> <p>EI provided a presentation which explained the documents/criteria etc. for the fellows.</p> <p>EI advised the group that she would email the first 5 documents for comment/agreement.</p> <p>EI asked if anyone would like to volunteer to develop the framework and SF agreed.</p> <p>EI advised that we will be emailing out to the network for colleagues to become mentors.</p> <p>The Health Equity Fellows is now coming close to finishing and there will be a celebration event, hopefully face to face. EI invited anyone in the group to attend and agreed to send the date.</p>	<p>EI/CA to email the first 5 documents to the group for comment/agreement.</p> <p>SF agreed to be part of the group developing the framework.</p> <p>EI to send the date of the Health Equity Fellows celebration event.</p>
6.	<p>Sub-Group Updates</p> <p>ATR Website</p> <p>EI advised that First Event who we have commissioned for the website, will be presenting at the Strategy Board and the Network Group for agreement and then we will be launching the website in the middle of October. Each 'place' will have their own page and we would welcome any content, i.e. links, videos, resources, website links.
