If anyone would like to have sight of this then please contact EI or CR.</p> <p>Programme Governance: EI reported Kersten England, Chief Executive of Bradford Metropolitan District Council is the lead Chief Executive for the WY Adversity, Trauma and Resilience programme of work.</p> <p>EI shared and talked through the Governance Structure Diagram.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The ATR network has been in place since June 2020 with a focus on preconception to 25 years. • It has been agreed that from September the West Yorkshire Multiple Needs Consortium will move into the governance structure for the WY ATR programme with a focus on 18 years plus. • These two groups will be brought together throughout the year to ensure a focus on the transition element • Next steps will be setting up the Training Collaborative, the Community Action Collective and the Task and Finish Groups • EI and CR will be writing out for membership for these groups <p>Case Studies & Pledges:</p> <p>ACTION: To send templates out with action notes for pledges and case studies.</p> <p>Calderdale Adults Safeguarding Board and Health & Well Being Board: EI/CR provided feedback from the meetings and will be looking at attending further Health and Wellbeing Boards in partnership with each place.</p>	1
4	<p>Adversity, Trauma and Resilience Strategy Board and Strategy</p> <p>CR reported that the first meeting of the Strategy Board took place last week. The focus of this meeting was to review the draft NHSE/I EOI before submission, including the priorities, 3 year action plan and financial plan.</p>	

	<p>The WY Adversity, Trauma and Resilience Strategy is planned to be developed and launched by April 2022. It was agreed that the next network meeting would be focused on agreeing the next steps around development</p>	2
5	<p>Changing Systems MC and SN thanked all for contributions to the system change work and presented on progress so far:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Had over 250 interventions so far for children. Trying to get an overall view of areas of provision and what kind of recommendations we can make going forward. • 50 interviews being conducted to add to mapping of services. • Work around support for 20-25 year olds. • A quarter to a third is provided through voluntary/third sector. Need to build on networks to reach smaller/under radar groups. • Have not asked about capacity of services and their ability to meet local need in unmet areas. • Undertaken an extensive literature review on areas e.g. domestic abuse, education and exclusions, criminal justice, poverty • Will also be developing a equality and inequality impact assessment: taking a broad view of services that address inequality. Will help prioritise actions we want to see. 	
6	<p>Task & Finish Groups and Pilots <i>Training Collaborative</i> <i>Community Action Collective</i> <i>Trauma Informed Schools</i> <i>Primary & Secondary Care</i> <i>Family Resilience and Early Help</i> <i>Potential Future workstreams</i></p> <p>Covered in Item 3. EI/CR asked what other pilots would be helpful to look at: key discussions included;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • community based activities for young people • A shift within schools from behaviour policies to relationship policies, so all staff use a trauma-informed approach for children. • How do we develop a trauma-informed system to support processes from a health and wellbeing point of view. • Self-harm and the significant correlation with suicide, particularly to young boys. Suicide rate to come down by 2030. Need to intervene as those issues emerge. • Speech trauma and communication development needs. Covid has caused a change in speech-language needs for young people. Look at how we upskill staff as many feel underconfident in this area. • Need to be able to demonstrate outcomes • Mentoring and support for young people. • Building aspirations
