1	Welcome and Introductions			
1	EI welcomed the group and asked people to put their name in the chat.			
2.	Trauma Education Report – Overview			
	EI asked LC to provide the overview and advised the group that the report will be			
	published on social media after this meeting.			
	LC provided an overview of the report.			

3.	The work being undertaken by the Young Carers Programme – Long TermConditions and Personalisation Function – Fiona Rogers and Rachel PalmerFR and RP advised the group that the WYHCP Unpaid Carers Programme has a dedicated Young Carers workstream to raise awareness, increase identification, support and signposting to Young Carer services. Young Carers face inequalities including lower academic attainment than their peers. Insight from WY young carers and Head Teachers indicated there was a need for resources to enable professionals to identify and support young carers. Working with local young carers and The Childrens Society, a leading national charity a webpage of bite sized learning materials has been developed including: one minute guides, quick wins, Children's Society Raising Awareness slides and local support services. A series of coproduced short films are soon to be added too and the film project piloted the
	 Guidance for Trauma Informed Coproduction. Link to website Young Carers :: West Yorkshire Health & Care Partnership (wypartnership.co.uk) The resources will be promoted and widely circulated in the new academic year to all education settings. Feedback on the new resources and support to promote and share amongst networks is welcomed. It is understood there will be a request from Spring 2023 for all schools to report the number of young carers in their School Census and the Young Carers Project Manager would like to support settings with the production of easy to access free bite sized resources to aid identification.
	 FR showed one of the bite sized videos and asked the group for feedback. After a group discussion, the feedback was very positive. FR thanked the group for their feedback and support and asked that if anyone has a special interest in Young Carers to link directly with FR, email address fiona.rogers3@nhs.net. FR also advised the group about a Young Carers Policy Forum taking place on

El explained the content of the Trauma Informed Education tab.
	In respect of communications and engagement there had been a discussion at the previous meeting regarding facilitating a symposium but after a further discussion between EI/CR/LC it was felt that this would be dififcult for education staff and therefore we are proposing that we have, in January, a trauma informed education awareness week so that people can dip in and out of during the day. EI asked the group their thoughts about an awareness week rather than a symposium and the response (in the chat) was that people felt it was a good idea. After a further discussion some members of the group felt that it may be beneficial to hold the awareness event over 2 weeks and over a half term holiday.
	After a group discussion it was felt the the awareness week should run over two weeks and include a half term.
	El advised that we will be setting up the following task and finish groups and an

	 email would be sent to colleagues to express an interest. LT asked if some context could included in the email to enable people to understand what the task and finish groups would include. El agreed. Mapping Best Practice Communications and Engagement Leadership and Accountability Workforce Development
4.	 Networking: Opportunities to share good practice and challenges EI asked the group if anyone had any good practice or challenges that they would like to share. EI spoke about the ongoing work with HMP Armley and advised that today the residents had discussed exclusion and they all said that they had all been excluded in school. EI explained to the group about a presentation that she had shared with the residents called 'The tale of 2 babies' and explained the pathway of children from different backgrounds. After seeing the presentation, the resident's have asked if they can produce some videos or video links with schools about their experiences and life in prison as they are very keen to support young people to avoid them having the experiences as themselves. The group felt that this would be beneficial and EI was asked whether staff could
	also be involved and EI agreed. EI advised that maybe one of the Education Workstream meetings could be themed on this. The group felt that it would be beneficial to have this as a video resource. EI agreed to have further discussions with the prison and feedback the ideas from this meeting. EI asked that if anyone was interested in working/piloting anything to contact Caroline Andrews.
